The family of a boy who lost vision in one eye after being treated for a bloody nose will receive \$3.8 million under a settlement approved on Wednesday.

Peter Delis, then 6, went to the University of Chicago Hospital in 2006 for a recurring bloody nose.

A lawsuit alleged that hospital staff failed to properly perform an embolization procedure, which stops blood flow to an area of the body.

As a result, the boy is completely blind in his left eye and has reduced vision in his right eye, the suit claimed.

David R. Barry Jr. of Corboy & Demetrio P.C. represented the parents. The hospital was represented by **Pamela L. Gellen** and **Bryan C. Larsen** of Lowis & Gellen LLP.
