### In Circuit Court

Cook County Circuit Judge **Jeffrey Lawrence** approved a \$4 million settlement on Tuesday, ending a medical malpractice lawsuit brought by a 54-year-old man who suffered a pre-surgery brain injury that forced him to stop working.

Jeffrey Disch was a broker who sold food to grocery stores and restaurants, his attorney said. He suffered a cerebral aneurysm and, before a surgical procedure in 2005, an accident occurred in the hospital that allowed an air embolism to enter his brain, according to the lawsuit.

The plaintiff was represented by **Barry R. Chafetz** of Corboy & Demetrio P.C.

Loyola University Medical Center and the Loyola University Physician Foundation were represented by **Terrence M. Burns** and **John M. Steed** of Dykema, Gossett PLLC. The defense attorneys declined to comment.
