

U.S. Senator Dick Durbin Appoints Philip Harnett Corboy, Jr. to Screening Committee

Philip Harnett Corboy, Jr., a Chicago personal injury lawyer at the Chicago-based law firm of Corboy & Demetrio, was recently appointed by U.S. Senator Dick Durbin to a bipartisan screening committee to assist the Senator in selecting Northern District Federal District Court Judges, U.S. Attorneys, and U.S. Marshals for the state of Illinois. Senator Durbin, will then review the recommendations, conduct interviews and submit his recommendations to the President.

"I am honored to be asked by Senator Durbin to serve on this important committee and look forward to working with the nine other distinguished and accomplished lawyers to recommend the best possible candidates to the Senator," said Corboy.
